CHAMBER SINGERS (ADVANCED MIXED)

The Chamber Singers is our advanced cocurricular group at Sandburg. Acceptance into this group is by audition only, and all participants must be enrolled in one of the curricular music programs at Sandburg. Chamber rehearses Monday evenings every week, with Wednesday zero hour mornings as needed. During first semester, this ensemble performs almost solely as a caroling group. The large performance schedule occurs during late November through December, and attendance at all rehearsals/ performances is imperative to stay in the group. During second semester, Chamber transforms into a pop a cappella group, singing everything from vocal jazz to Pentatonix charts. From time to time, the bass and treble voices will split to perform as two separate, smaller groups during either semester, as needed for school and community performance needs may dictate. This ensemble receives many performance invitations Sandburg activities and for local organizations and businesses in the community throughout the year.

COLOR GUARD

Color Guard is a performing component of the Marching Band that is trained in dance, flag, rifle and saber. Color Guard competes with the Marching Band at all competitions in the fall. Auditions only.

FALL PLAY

The fall play presents students with the opportunity to act, assistant direct, assistant stage manage, construct sets and work on lighting, sound and running crews.

FALL PLAY TECH CREW

The tech crew allows students to explore handson experience in the field of technical theater, including lighting, sound, prop building, scene construction and design, special effects and stage management.





JAZZ BAND

Jazz Band educates students in the style of jazz, including Swing, Be-Bop, Blues, Latin, Funk and Rock. Membership by audition.

ORCHESIS DANCE TROUPE

Orchesis is a performing arts troupe that performs throughout the year in various settings. Dance styles vary from ballet to jazz, hip-hip and modern to tap. Membership is through audition only.

MARCHING BAND

The Aquila is our student newspaper covering the high school community. Aquila competes in various competitions. All students are eligible to write articles and take photos. Editors must apply for positions. This coming year we will be publishing both a print and digital edition.

YEARBOOK (POET)

The student yearbook, the Poet, is published each year in May. The book is entirely created by students, who are responsible for design, photography, and copy. Yearbook meets once/week during the year from August-March. All students must complete an application to join to determine position, but all are accepted and welcome!

FIRST CLASS AMBASSADORS

First Class Ambassadors must be able to speak in front of groups of people, have the ability to motivate others and possess a positive attitude. Ambassadors are highly motivated, energetic, and hard-working.

INTERACT CLUB

Interact is a club for youth ages 12-18 who want to connect with others in their community or school. Interact club members have fun while carrying out service projects and learning about the world. Interact clubs organize at least two service projects a year: one that benefits their community and one that encourages international understanding. While Interact clubs receive guidance from individual Rotary clubs, they govern and support themselves. One of the primary purposes of Interact is to build leadership qualities in the members. The connection with the Rotary club gives students a firsthand look at exactly what leadership entails. Interact members develop self-realization, good citizenship, and general growth in each of the students involved.

KEY CLUB

Key Club helps build leadership in students through community service and to strengthen school and community ties through positive social interactions between students and community leaders/organizations. Membership is open.

RELAY FOR LIFE

SWIM GUARD

School sponsors, Elected officers, and club participants work together to plan monthly activities that help provide opportunities for increased socialization. Monthly events initially include after-school parties and attendance of school-sponsored events such as sporting events, school plays, dances etc. After-school monthly events are from 3:00 – 4:00. Community Service Hours are provided for club activities during weekend and evening events.

SAGA

The gay-straight alliance is a group that meets twice a month to provide a safe space for all members of the straight, LGBTQ, and non-binary communities within the Sandburg family. We'll discuss pressing issues of the day, schedule field trips, and put on all-inclusive activities like meet and greets with other groups or dances.
